Approximately ten years ago, I was researching how to improve executive functioning skills for my students with disabilities. At that time, I was teaching resource reading to students with learning disabilities. I was following the curriculum, but I felt something was missing. These students were in 5th and 6th grade and were reading at the same levels they had been for a few years, but I was doing everything I knew how to do.
